


Info of Malaysian Wayang Kulit shadow puppet came to Malaysia about 500 years ago

Malaysian version


- * more sturdy & solid
- * inner arm holding a tool/weapon
- * main character standing on a naga.


Javanese version





Malaysian version: puppet colors are visible during performance. because we use translucent pigments (Art-line inks & marker pens)












Back hand (inner arm):

- Usually the puppet will be holding the tool that represent his/her job or occupation.
- Archers= bow and arrow, Soldier= sword, Princess= hand fan.
- Visually this helps audience to identify who the character is.








Base (Tanah):

- main characters will be standing on a dragon (Naga), or sometimes a creature. It was meant to show the status or the position of the character.
- Secondary characters will be standing on piece of ground (Tanah).
- From the puppeteer's point of view, this serve as something useful because it connects both of the puppet's leg together, minimise the chances of tangling with other puppets (which might tear the puppet apart).








